# ANNEX A: FACTSHEET ON CONSTRUCTION SUPPORT PACKAGE

- 1. The Construction Support Package consists of a set of support measures to provide support for firms in the construction sector in cashflow, business sustainability and compliance costs to COVID-Safe restart criteria.
- 2. A breakdown of support measures under the Construction Support Package is tabled below.

- Co-share, on ex-gratia basis, 50% of the non-manpower prolongation costs for delays due to (i) the Circuit Breaker (CB) and Controlled Restart post-CB, and (ii) loss of productivity in compliance with COVID-Safe requirements. Co-share up to 0.2% of contract sum per month of delay, capped at 1.8% of contract sum
- Supportable examples include plant & equipment, and site maintenance costs
- Claims for delays must be accompanied by certified Extensions of Time (EOTs) due to COVID-19

### Qualifying Criteria

Public sector construction works with on-going contracts and tenders closed on or before 1 June 2020

## **Compliance Costs to COVID-Safe Restart Criteria**

Booster

Construction Restart Provide support for additional compliance costs incurred by the sector in order to resume works safely

#### About the scheme

Co-share contractors' costs in procuring additional material/equipment to comply with COVID-Safe worksite requirements (e.g. additional portable toilets, PPEs, masks, barricades).

### Qualifying criteria

Funding will be given to all ongoing construction projects with project reference number registered with BCA as at 27 Jun 2020, regardless of whether they have restarted or are pending restart

4 Support for Singaporean/PR Safe Management Officers (SMOs)

One of the restart criteria is the appointment of SMO on project site. The Government will co-fund the wages of SMOs to provide support to employers on the compliance costs incurred.

#### About the Scheme

- Government will co-fund 50% of the first \$4,600 of gross monthly wages for each Singapore Citizen and Permanent Resident SMO
- For a period of 6 months from September 2020 to February 2021
