CIRCULAR ON THE REVISED STANDARD CONSULTANCY AGREEMENT (SCA)

This circular informs all firms registered on the Public Sector Panels of Consultants (PSPC) regarding the revised Standard Consultancy Agreement (SCA) effective from 1 November 2024.

Background

- The SCA is a standard contract form used when government agencies procure constructionrelated consultancy services in Architecture, Civil & Structural Engineering, Mechanical & Electrical Engineering, Quantity Surveying and Project Management. The SCA comprises the standard conditions of contract between government agencies and their consultants, covering the scope of service, obligations and liabilities, procedures for payment and settlement of disputes, among others.
- 3 Under the Built Environment (BE) Industry Transformation Map (ITM), we seek to promote greater collaboration and value chain transformation to realise a world-class and resilient BE sector. To promote more progressive contracting practices, BCA has worked with relevant Trade Association and Chambers¹, major consultancy firms, the Ministry of Finance and government agencies to identify common paint points and propose enhancements to the SCA.
- 4 As Mr Desmond Lee, Minister for National Development, announced at the International Built Environment Week on 4 September 2024, the enhanced SCA will be ready for implementation for procurement of construction-related consultancy services from 1 November 2024 onwards.

Key revisions to the SCA

- 5 The three intended outcomes for this round of SCA enhancements are as follows.
 - (a) Provide clearer definition of scope of services so that agencies and consultants are aligned upfront in their understanding of the consultants' roles and responsibilities;
 - (b) Maintain fair and timely remuneration, commensurate with the scope of work provided; and

(c) Provide a more balanced allocation of risk, especially to address unanticipated events.

7 The revised SCA applies to all procurement of public sector construction consultancy services (for both quotations and tenders) <u>called on and after 1 November 2024</u>.
