The Accessibility Fund provides grant to owners of private buildings to improve the accessibility of their existing buildings.

The Fund is available until end March 2027.



Built Friends Environme

A friendly built environment enables people of all ages and abilities to lead active and independent lives. Buildings that are accessible and designed to be user-friendly will benefit all users, including elderly or persons using mobility aids and families with prams. Building owners and industry practitioners play an important role in making Singapore an inclusive and age-friendly city

Who Can Apply?

Private building owners, lessors who have ownership rights to upgrade the building, and lessees who can carry out the upgrading works with the approval of the owners/lessors.

For Private Buildings Built Before the Implementation of Code on Barrier-Free Accessibility in Buildings 1990 that do not have Basic Accessibility Features

- · Accessible approach to building
- Ramps/lifts for improving accessibility in building's first storey
- Accessible toilet in building's first storey or entrance level
- Signage for finding way to building's accessibility features
- Lifts that are compliant with SS 550 (up to S\$200,000 per lift)
